BEFORE YOU START

You don't need a perfect résumé. You need five specific habits.

THE 5 HABITS — PART 1

Habit 01

Global Networking

You don't need hundreds of connections. You need a handful of real conversations with people already working where you want to be.

- ☐ **Try this today:** Message one person outside your country this week. Ask a specific question about their move, not for a job.

Habit 02

Interview Reps

Fluency under pressure is a rehearsed skill, not a talent. The gap between "I know this" and "I can say this out loud" only closes with repetition.

- ☐ **Try this today:** Record yourself answering one common interview question out loud, in English, for 60 seconds. Play it back.

Habit 03

Target-Market Mapping

Applying everywhere feels productive but usually isn't. A handful of the right markets will out-perform a hundred random applications.

- ☐ **Try this today:** Pick 3 countries actively sponsoring your field. Note their hiring season before you send your next application.

THE 5 HABITS — PART 2

Habit 04

Résumé Localization

A résumé that works in one region can quietly disqualify you in another. Format, length, and even the word "résumé" itself change by market.

- ☐ **Try this today:** Look up the standard résumé format for your #1 target country and rewrite just your summary line to match it.

Habit 05

Visa & Relocation Literacy

Learning the visa pathway after you get the offer is too late for some employers. Knowing it in advance makes you a lower-risk, more attractive hire.

- ☐ **Try this today:** Look up the main work-visa category for your top target country, and note who is eligible to sponsor it.

YOUR 7-DAY STARTER CHECKLIST

**Pick one habit. Do it today.
Repeat tomorrow.**

- ☐ Message one person outside your country
- ☐ Record a 60-second interview answer in English
- ☐ Shortlist 3 countries actively sponsoring your field
- ☐ Rewrite your résumé summary for your #1 target market
- ☐ Look up the visa category for that market
